WELCOME TO THE GN PAPANICOLAOU ODYSSEY HONORARY SYMPOSIUM

A Historical Milestone



On behalf of *CellPathology Plus*, it gives me great pleasure to welcome delegates from around the world to this Honorary Symposium, dedicated to the legacies of Dr. George N. Papanicolaou and of his wife, Andromache. This husband-and-wife team selflessly dedicated their lives for the betterment of science and humanity. In keeping, this Symposium has their memory deep at heart, and promises to be a celebration of their titanic achievements. During and after this Symposium, and from the lens of his birthplace, Kymi, Greece, we celebrate the meaning of Dr. Papanicolaou's life and work

and, by natural extension, the inception and global scale of modern Clinical Cytopathology.

I extend sincere gratitude to the Office of the Mayor of Kymi & Aliveri, the Honorable Athanasios Bourantas, for embracing and supporting this Symposium. Likewise, no expression of appreciation may possibly suffice to acknowledge the enthusiasm and support received from friends and colleagues from around the world towards this event. The spontaneous convergence of so much energy can only be taken as a true reflection of our common passion for the work of Dr. G. N. Papanicolaou. In essence, this Honorary Symposium is an acknowledgement of inheritance. In Clinical Cytopathology, Dr. Papanicolaou is regarded our forefather; although, in our Hellenic culture and ethnic identity, he stands as majestic as the Parthenon against the blue sky. He shall remain an ageless beacon of inspiration for generations to come.

Dr. Papanicolaou was born in Kymi in 1883 but his professional odyssey took him to Cornell Medical College, New York, in 1914. There, his 44-year career was adorned by indelible accolades; meanwhile the impact of his work continues to impress and expand globally. Starting in 1920, he investigated his scientific method with his wife, Andromache, and her samples containing epithelial cells formed the basis for an emerging medical discipline. In 1925, Dr. Papanicolaou encountered cervical cancer cells in ill women and these foundations led to the development of the Pap test for the prevention of cervical cancer through populationbased screening. The American Cancer Society endorsed the Pap test in 1948. And it was subsequently launched into screening service in the USA by 1957, from where it expanded into Europe and elsewhere. Due to the Pap test a near 80% reduction in the incidence and mortality of cervical cancer has been evidenced in developed nations applying it in systematic, population-based screening programs.

The GN Papanicolaou Odyssey, Honorary Symposium, marks a historical milestone just over 60 years since his death in 1962 and promises to leave behind a legacy of its own. The Symposium has enlisted distinguished national and international speakers to deliver 12 presentations commemorating Dr. Papanicolaou's work from varied perspectives. A presentation by Dr. Giouli Kokkori launches the Symposium with a true sense of inheritance. It is with utmost anticipation and gratefulness that I welcome all of you to Kymi. Net proceeds from this event will go to support the Dr. G. N. Papanicolaou exhibit in the Folklore Museum of Kymi, and to foster diagnostic services at the local George N. Papanikolaou General Hospital.

I wish you all a memorable Symposium. I also wish you a spectacular journey as you seek to discover all the splendors of both historical and modern Greece. Hopefully your schedule will allow you to also visit other historical and archeological attractions, and our unique islands, and not only.

Travel

Delegates from all corners of the globe are welcome to attend this Honorary Symposium.


International attendees may arrive at the **Athens International Airport** - **Eleftherios Venizelos** (<u>https://www.aia.gr/traveler/</u>) in Spata at the eastern margin of the Capital city of Greece, Athens.

Kymi is located north-east of Athens, on the eastern shoreline of Euboea, overlooking the Aegean Sea.

Kymi is 148 kilometers from Athens by road, approximately a 2.5-hour drive. For international visitors, this would be the easiest way to reach Kymi.

From the airport, delegates have the option of renting a vehicle and driving to Kymi, although may hire a taxi instead. Bus services to Kymi are also available from the central bus station in Athens.

To legally drive in Greece, international visitors must carry a valid **International Driver's License**. It is advisable to reserve car rentals in advance.

Accommodation

The Palace Hotel hosts the Honorary Symposium. Adjacent to the Palace Hotel is the Corali Hotel.



"OUR HOSPITAL

The General Hospital - Kymi Health Center of Evia, was founded with the 87 FEK 29/05/1964 square A, with the name "Kymi General Hospital" as NPDD and with a capacity of 30 beds. In the first years it was housed in a large home in the center of the city, while later it was moved to another, more spacious building. In the mid-70s, efforts began to rebuild the Hospital, which was inaugurated on 15/08/1980.

Within the framework of the National Health System, new specialties were added and the operation of the Health Center was added, giving another dimension to the provision of Primary Health Care.

Today it provides health services in basic specialties, it has developed 40 beds, with a pathological and surgical department and a specialized nephrology department with an Artificial Kidney Unit with 7 beds. In parallel, within the framework of the Health Reform, new actions and operations are planned that aim to upgrade the health services provided, both to the permanent residents and to the thousands of tourists of the wider area of Kymi."

Museum & Birth Home Visits, Dinner & Festivities

Kymi Town Square, St. Athanasios Cathedral

Friday, September 15, 2023, 6-10 pm

Delegates and guests are invited to enjoy the Honorary Symposium traditional dinner and festivities. These events will be organized in the Kymi town square adjacent to the splendid St. Athanasios Cathedral, just steps from the bronze bust of Dr. G. N. Papanicolaou and a few yards away from his birth home.

Kymi and the surrounding region has a rich history, and is renowned for almond deserts, olive oil, and figs.

Delegates and guests will be transported from the Palace Hotel to the Folklore Museum in upper Kymi which houses the G. N. Papanicolaou exhibit amongst other cultural displays. The Folklore Museum showcases the region's inheritance through curated exhibits and artifacts from traditional clothing to embroidery and pottery. From the Museum's amphitheatric vantagepoint, one beholds the blue Aegean Sea; and for this, Kymi is also romantically known as the '*Balcony of the Aegean*'. In this veranda we shall enjoy traditional music and dance. From the Museum we will proceed to visit the Papanicolaou family homestead; and from there, stroll along towards the town square just yards away.

Kymi is also known for her magnificent St. Athanasios Cathedral in the center of the town square in pristine Byzantine architecture. The St. Athanasios Cathedral and the GN Papanicolaou Odyssey, Honorary Symposium, share a rather unique commonality as the name '*Athanasios*' in Greek literally means: *Immortal*. This relationship marks a striking symbolism for a scientist whose life and work we celebrate and immortalize through this event.

The dinner and planned festivities aim to tantalize the senses. The event should leave you with unforgettable memories of Kymi and of her local traditions, and of our Hellenic culture under a blue sky.




